## Pastor's Message

### **Cheap Grace/Costly Grace**

When I was in North Carolina in September, I passed by a lot where a new building was going up. I'm not sure what the building is going to be but the huge sign out front read: **Dirt For Sale**.

Something about this sign struck me as rather ridiculous! To tell you the truth, I was a little upset about it. Some entity was trying to make a profit on the dirt it <u>needs</u> to get rid of before a new building can go up. Good old North Carolina red clay dirt, rocks and all, for sale. I'm sure someone somewhere probably needs fill dirt but the idea of selling just plain old dirt struck me as capitalism sinking to a new low. Commodifying dirt! Something we try to keep out of our houses, our clothes, and our food. But if we put a price tag on it, someone will buy it, right? We've even managed to commodify the Bible! But there's one thing that isn't for sale - God's grace. It can't be bought. It can't be earned. It is freely given. And it requires a response.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer\*, in his book *The Cost of Discipleship*, writes that there are two kinds of grace – **cheap grace** and **costly grace**. Cheap grace is "sold on the market". Cheap grace is forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession, grace without discipleship, without the cross and without Jesus Christ.

Costly grace, on the other hand, calls us to follow Jesus. Costly grace is confession. It is repentance, it is church discipline, it is communion, and discipleship and the cross and Jesus Christ. Costly grace is seeking the gospel again and again where we learn what it means to be a disciple of Christ. Worship, reading scripture, caring for others, these are not prices we pay to buy God's grace, but responses to God's gift of grace through Jesus.

How are we responding to God's gift of grace as individuals and as the church?

\*Dietrich Bonhoeffer (4 February 1906 – 9 April 1945) was a German Lutheran pastor, neo-orthodox theologian and anti-Nazi dissident who was a key founding member of the Confessing Church. His writings on Christianity's role in the secular world have become widely influential; his 1937 book The Cost of Discipleship is described as a modern classic. Apart from his theological writings, Bonhoeffer was known for his staunch resistance to the Nazi dictatorship, including vocal opposition to Adolf Hitler's euthanasia program and genocidal persecution of the Jews. He was arrested in April 1943 by the Gestapo and imprisoned at Tegel Prison for 1½ years. Later, he was transferred to Flossenbürg concentration camp. Bonhoeffer was accused of being associated with the 20 July plot to assassinate Hitler and was tried along with other accused plotters, including former members of the Abwehr (the German Military Intelligence Office). He was hanged on 9 April 1945 during the collapse of the Nazi regime.)

We followed the intricate steps of their dance. Listened to their booming, burbling calls. And stared at one another in joyous wonder. To be witnesses to this stunning performance at the end of our long, cold vigil.

Keep watch. Be ready. Trust that when the sun rises, there will be something to see.
